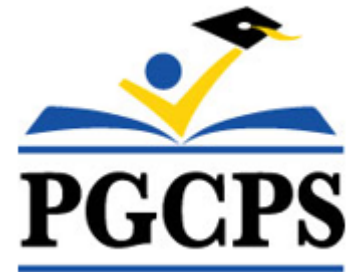

Fast Facts

- Founded in 1947
- Largest university in Maryland
- Ranked #1
 - among University of System of Maryland (USM) schools in degrees conferred

Stand-alone cert; credits apply toward B.S. in Artificial Intelligence.

Spanish for Business and the Professions

SPAN 211 or 212 — placement-based | Pilot at 1 school

Placement exam deadline July 31. Two-cohort model: prerequisites pathway (US-2) or direct placement (US-3). Stand-alone cert; credits apply toward B.S. in General Studies.

BMGT 110 (Fall US-3, Oct 14) | BMGT 364 (Spring 2027)

Stand-alone cert; credits apply toward B.S. in Business Administration and Management.

Tips for Success at UMGC...

Stay on Top of Deadlines

- Check your course several times each week.
- Keep track of weekly assignment and discussion deadlines.
- Don't wait until the last minute to complete your work.

• Manage Your Time

- Set aside dedicated study time each week.
- Plan to spend about **9 hours per week** on each course.
- Use a calendar or planner to stay organized.

• Log In Regularly

- Read course announcements and updates.
- Review assignments early so you know what is expected.
- Stay engaged throughout the week.

Tips for Success at UMGC con't...

Ask for Help

- Reach out to your instructor if you have questions.
- Use UMGC's academic support services when needed.
- Don't wait until you are falling behind to seek assistance.

Create a Good Study Environment

- Find a quiet place to study.
- Limit distractions such as social media and texting.
- Focus on completing one task at a time.

Be Consistent

- Complete a little work each week rather than cramming before deadlines.
- Stay organized and keep up with your coursework.
- Remember that success comes from regular participation and effort.

Most importantly: UMGC courses are flexible and asynchronous, but there are weekly deadlines. Students who log in regularly, manage their time well, and stay on top of assignments are most likely to be successful.
