1 AN ACT concerning

Maryland Cybersecurity Council – Membership – Revisions

3 FOR the purpose of altering the membership of the Maryland Cybersecurity Council to 4 include the State Administrator of Elections or the State Administrator's designee; $\mathbf{5}$ altering the number of members of the respective houses of the General Assembly 6 that the President of the Senate and the Speaker of the House of Delegates may 7 appoint to serve on the Council; authorizing the Minority Leader of the Senate and the Minority Leader of the House of Delegates to appoint one member of their 8 respective houses of the General Assembly to serve on the Council; prohibiting the 9 10 Minority Leader of the Senate and the Minority Leader of the House of Delegates 11 from making an initial appointment under certain circumstances until a certain condition is met; and generally relating to the membership of the Maryland 12 13Cybersecurity Council.

(1) may not receive compensation as a member of the Council; but

11 (2) is entitled to reimbursement for expenses under the Standard State 12 Travel Regulations, as provided in the State budget.

13 (j) The Council shall work with the National Institute of Standards and 14 Technology and other federal agencies, private sector businesses, and private cybersecurity 15 experts to:

16 (1) for critical infrastructure not covered by federal law or the Executive 17 Order, review and conduct risk assessments to determine which local infrastructure sectors 18 are at the greatest risk of cyber attacks and need the most enhanced cybersecurity 19 measures;

20 (2) use federal guidance to identify categories of critical infrastructure as 21 critical cyber infrastructure if cyber damage or unauthorized cyber access to the 22 infrastructure could reasonably result in catastrophic consequences, including:

(i) interruption in the provision of energy, water, transportation,
emergency services, food, or other life-sustaining services sufficient to cause a mass
casualty event or mass evacuations;

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(ii) catastrophic economic damage; or

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(iii) severe degradation of State or national security;

(3) assist infrastructure entities that are not covered by the Executive
Order in complying with federal cybersecurity guidance;

30 (4) assist private sector cybersecurity businesses in adopting, adapting,
31 and implementing the National Institute of Standards and Technology cybersecurity
32 framework of standards and practices;

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1 (5) examine inconsistencies between State and federal laws regarding 2 cybersecurity;

3 (6) recommend a comprehensive State strategic plan to ensure a 4 coordinated and adaptable response to and recovery from cybersecurity attacks; and

5 (7) recommend any legislative changes considered necessary by the 6 Council to address cybersecurity issues.

7 (k) Beginning July 1, 2017, and every 2 years thereafter, the Council shall submit 8 a report of its activities to the General Assembly in accordance with § 2–1246 of this article.

9 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That:

10 (a) If two members of the Senate are serving on the Maryland Cybersecurity 11 Council on the effective date of this Act, the Minority Leader of the Senate may not make 12 an initial appointment under § 9–2901(d)(2) of the State Government Article, as enacted 13 by Section 1 of this Act, until one of the members is no longer serving on the Council.

14 (b) If two members of the House of Delegates are serving on the Maryland 15 Cybersecurity Council on the effective date of this Act, the Minority Leader of the House of 16 Delegates may not make an initial appointment under § 9-2901(e)(2) of the State 17 Government Article, as enacted by Section 1 of this Act, until one of the members is no 18 longer serving on the Council.

SECTION 3. 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect October 1, 2018.
